


Suffolk Wildlife Trust's role in the Development Management process

1) Application site is on or adjacent to a County Wildlife Site, other non-statutorily designated nature conservation site or Suffolk Wildlife Trust reserve




Statutory and non-statutory designated sites in Suffolk

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
2) Application is for major development requiring an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)



3) Application is accompanied by an ecological survey where a non-European protected species, Biodiversity Action Plan (BAP) species or Biodiversity Action Plan (BAP) habitat is confirmed to be present/likely to be present



4) Application meets the consultation requirements set out in the Suffolk Biodiversity Partnership guidance on Bats and Small Wind Turbines



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
